The American Board of Toxicology (ABT) is committed to staying in step with these changes, ensuring that obtaining the status of "Diplomate" remains the pinnacle of professional toxicologists world-wide.

With more than 2300 active Diplomates representing 26 different countries, the Board relies on the tremendous support from volunteers to serve our community of professional toxicologists. In the pages below, and through contact with our executive offices in Raleigh, NC, you can find many interesting ways to serve ABT. If you feel as if you have benefitted by achieving the honor of Diplomate status, please contact us and see how a few hours of your time can help.

The Board has now had a chance to analyze the feedback received following the important changes that were made in the October exam and the first round of our modified recertification process. The results indicate that our work over the past few years has been well received. A majority of the 2017 candidates responding to the post-exam survey indicated that they liked the improvements. The Board has responded to the recommendations they made about the practice application (app) and it's been upgraded to reflect those comments. We'll continue to improve the app as a study tool for the ABT exam and hope that candidates, prospective toxicologists, and seasoned professionals find it useful for practicing their knowledge about important emerging issues and basic toxicological sciences. If you haven't tried the practice app, check it out at the Apple Store or on Google Play.

This is the time of year when those of us who have served for four years on the Board will be making room for some new leadership. It's been a great honor for me to take a turn at the helm of the ABT for the past year. Take a few minutes to meet and greet the new leadership at our SOT booth. LOGO UPDATE

Thank you to all who submitted ideas for a new ABT logo. The Board is reviewing them along with other options. Look for a new logo later this year!

Treasurer's Report

ABT continues to be financially sound with sufficient reserves in the money market and investment portfolio. As of December 31, 2017, total ABT assets were \$699,303 compared to \$613,126 in 2016. Assets were comprised of \$81,421 in checking and money market accounts, \$30,000 in a CD account, \$587,877 in the investment account consisting of equity and income mutual funds (15% gain for the year), and \$5 miscellaneous.

Total revenues were \$252,275 and total expenses were \$234,714 for the year. Compared to the previous year, income increased by 1% and expenses decreased by 8% in 2017. The net gain for 2017 was \$17,561. The lower number of recertifications was offset by a significantly higher number of certifications. More importantly, expenses were greatly controlled by a lower cost of Board meetings and various committee meetings, and a lower cost to administer the single-day certification exam in October.

Unaudited financial summary

One key expense item anticipated for 2018 will be to update the outdated ABT website with a newly enhanced version. It is anticipated that the cost of the new website will be significant which likely may lead to a deficit for 2018. Anticipating this deficit, selected expenses (such as exam software and insurance) were paid in December 2017 to offset total expenses. The expenses in 2018 will be closely monitored and expenses minimized where possible. If additional cash is needed, a transfer will be made from the reserve funds to balance the account. The investment policy of ABT specifies the method and the limit of the withdrawal of the assets.

In July 2016, the Board updated the ABT Investment Policy and hired a new investment advisor, Lynx Investment Advisory, LLC, a highly recognized firm that man-

ages investments on behalf of many not-for-profit organizations.

The well-balanced investment portfolio with a continued economic gain has seen a high return on the investment.

gain has seen a high return on the investment. At the end of 2017, a total investment was \$587,877 (15% gain for the year). The investment amount and a CD account make up the total reserve funds.

Following the ABT's strategic board meeting in January 2016, many changes in the ABT certification and recertification process have been successfully instituted in 2017. To continue the enhancements, the Board has approved the 2018 ABT budget. The Treasurer and the Executive Director continue to monitor the monthly revenues and expenses, and update the Board to balance the new initiatives while practicing fiscal responsibility.

As I conclude the 4-year term as a Board member of the ABT that included the last 3 years as a Treasurer and as a member of the Executive Committee, it has been an honor for me to serve the ABT and to make major contributions to the certification of toxicologists. In addition to the Board duties, I am absolutely gratified that the ABT has established a sound financial stability during the last 3 years to position well for the future. It would be foolish for me to think that this was the responsibility of one person's work. The credit goes to the entire Board and the Executive Director who took the ABT's fiscal management to heart - thank you for making this job easier for me. I wish the next generation of the ABT's Board all the success as we welcome a new wave of ABT-certified toxicologists and continue to recertify established toxicologists to maintain their Diplomate status. Finally, I would like to specially thank Susie Masten and Laurie Wood at the ABT office, both who have supported me and other Board members tirelessly.

*After March 31, 2018, a late penalty of \$150 is assessed. ABT is not accountable for any lost or undelivered mail. All fees are non-refundable.


Continuing Education Credit Changes

One of the changes in the recertification process that began in 2017 is the credit system for continuing education activities. The allowable number of credits for various activities was updated. Diplomates, especially those recertifying this year, should ensure that they are entering the correct number of credits in their online accounts. A full listing of activities and allowable credits for activities both pre- and post-2017 are available in the Recertification Handbook. The handbook is a very helpful resource and can be downloaded from the ABT website. One especially notable change that comes to mind as SOT draws near is that the credits for Professional Meeting attendance are now limited to 10 per year rather than the previous 15. Also, if you are having trouble obtaining CE credits, contact the ABT office now for guidance! This is much preferred to waiting until it is time to recertify and finding you are short!

2017 Certification Exam Update

The new format of the ABT Certification Examination was administered for the first time in 2017, with more candidates registering for the exam than any year since 1981. In addition to being based on the Practice Analysis published in 2016, several other changes were made. These included shortening the exam from 300 to 200 questions, having only four answer choices per question rather than five, administering it on one day instead of over two, and grading it as a whole instead of three separate parts. A post-examination survey was given to all candidates and overall the feedback was positive. The survey results can be viewed on the ABT website. The Board has taken many steps to address the feedback received. For example, the practice app will be re-released this month with questions more reflective of the new format and more detailed feedback was provided in result letters to candidates. Information regarding the process for setting the passing score was also published.

Why doesn't ABT have a Retired or Emeritus status? SOT does!

Long-Time Diplomate

Dear Long-Timer:

I am glad you asked this question- we hear it a lot! Actually, ABT used to have a "Retired" status, but upon legal advice, it was eliminated by the Board in 2010. Unlike SOT, ABT is not a membership organization but rather a credentialing body with a responsibility to the public to ensure that any toxicologist using the DABT credential has met the requirements for both certification and recertification. If a DABT is granted "Retired" status but still practicing as a toxicologist, that is not only unfair to other Diplomates still undergoing recertification, but also creates risk of confusion and potential liability for ABT. Since it is impossible to determine if a person claiming "Retired Status" is still practicing, the Board stopped offering this designation. Please note that any former Diplomate may indicate that s/he was certified by designating the appropriate years of certification, as in the example below:




New Website Coming!

Toxicology Tidbit

Strategic Roadmap Establishing for New Approaches to Evaluate the Safety of Chemicals and Medical Products in the United States" was published January 30th on the National Toxicology Program's It was developed by 16 federal government agencies and interagency workgroups. The 2-year effort included a retrospective analysis and critical evaluation of operating principles and practices used to develop and validate alternative methods over the past 20 years. "This document improves on similar previous efforts in some very significant ways," noted ABT Diplomate Warren Casey, Ph.D., Director of the NTP Interagency Center for the Evaluation of Alternative Toxicological Methods (NICEATM), which supports ICCVAM.
